The 105th Airlift Wing continued to demonstrate commitment to the mission throughout 2020 by supporting national and state objectives with highly skilled people and operationally ready equipment.



GLOBAL STRATEGIC AIRLIFT

The C-17 requires a crew of three: a pilot, copilot and loadmaster. The cargo is loaded through an aft ramp into a cargo bay that is large enough to accommodate an M1 Abrams Main Battle Tank and versatile enough to transport the newly developed Negatively Pressurized Conex (NPC) system which was heavily utilized for COVID-19 Aeromedical Evacuation missions.

The 105th Airlift Wing routinely mobilizes and deploys aircrews and aircraft to support United States military missions around the world. From 2020 through 2021 the wing conducted missions within, Central Command, Africa Command, Northern Command, European Command, Pacific Command.

OPERATIONS ACHIEVEMENTS

Continuous support of the National Science Foundation's research in the Antarctic regions by providing airlift to New Zealand and Greenland.

Deployed crews to support the United States Air Force's only world-wide COVID-19 Aeromedical Evacuation Stage located in Ramstein, Germany.

Performed nearly 4000 flying hours, transported more than 429 thousand pounds of cargo as well as a total of 296 passengers in support of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Conducted global airlift support ranging from humanitarian relief to evacuation flights out of Afghanistan.

Responsible for overall fleet health through the administration, analysis, training management of assigned personnel, and programs and resources necessary to support production efforts.

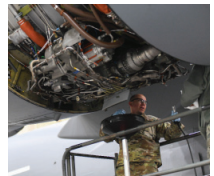
MAINTENANCE ACHIEVEMENTS

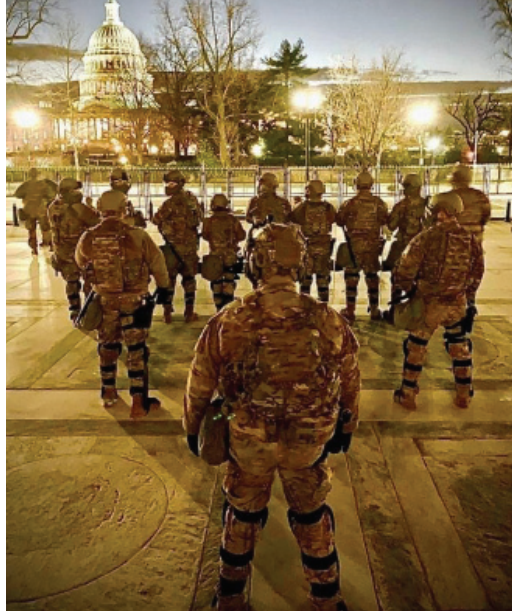
213TH ENGINEERING AND INSTALLATION SQUADRON

MEDICAL GROUP

Provides high-quality, compassionate, patient-centered health services to the Wing, while optimizing the medical readiness of the force and enhancing the well-being of those that we serve.



BIOENVIRONMENTAL ENGINEERING

Bioenvironmental Engineering identifies health hazards as well as potable and non-potable water sources, executes Occupational & Environmental Health Site Assessment, responds to terrorist attacks, natural disasters or accidents which may result in exposure to health threats, conducts examinations to reduce health risk or negative impact in future operations, and advises senior leadership and affected communities on health risks associated with operations and missions.



AEROSPACE MEDICINE

The Base Operational Medical Clinic (BOMC) utilizes a cross functional team directly supporting the Air Force Medical Service readiness mission. Standard workflows developed within aerospace medicine include Periodic Health Assessments, Medical Clearances, Command Screening Boards, Separation History and Physical Examinations (SHPEs), Airman Availability, Deployment-Related Health Assessments, Occupational Health and sustainment.



NY-CBRN TASK FORCE MEDICAL ELEMENT

Ensuring the safety and security of the homeland, the Medical Element delivers 24/7 emergency medical response capabilities to the Homeland Response Force (HRF) and provides sophisticated, short-duration, pre-hospital emergency medical triage and treatment during a mass casualty chemical, biological, radiological and nuclear (CBRN) or All-Hazard incident with the ability to stabilize and treat 330 patients in a 12-hour period.



PUBLIC HEALTH

Whether active in the field or performing duties on base, the safety of the 105th Airmen is a top priority. It's the job of Public Health specialists to protect the force from a vast array of illness and disease by minimizing health risks within the community.

Responsible for everything from educating Airmen on safety procedures and food inspection to investigating hazardous materials and sanitary standards, these professionals perform public health activities, ensuring that all Airmen remain healthy on bases all over the world.

Managed tracking and reporting for over 1,300 105th Airmen and their families throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

Participated in the planning, set up, and command of the Javits Center COVID treatment facility.

Provided Health Care professionals to support COVID testing and immunizations across NYS.

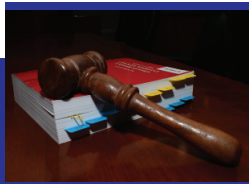

PSYCHOLOGICAL HEALTH (DPH)

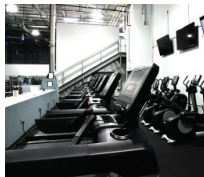

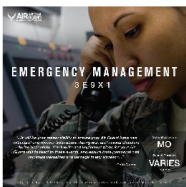

WING HISTORY



In 1948, the 137th Fighter Squadron of the New York Air National Guard received federal recognition and began operations at the Westchester County Airport in White Plains, NY. The unit was initially equipped with F-47 Thunderbolt aircraft. In September 1952, the unit was re-designated as the 137th Fighter Interceptor Squadron and received the F-51 Mustang aircraft along with a new air defense mission.

In 1953, the unit entered the jet age when it received the F-94 Starfighter all-weather interceptor. The unit retained its air defense mission until 1958 when it converted to the F-86 Saber and was reorganized as the 105th Tactical Fighter Group. In February 1961, the unit was re-designated again as the 105th Aeromedical Transport Group and received its first C-119 Flying Boxcar aircraft. The unit later converted to the C-97 Stratocruiser, a four-engine strategic transport, which enabled the 105th to participate in Southeast Asia operations. A more recent phase of the unit's history began in 1970 with its re-designation as the 105th Tactical Air Support Group, and its assignment to forward air control and communications missions, flying the O-2A Skymaster for the Tactical Air Command.

In May of 1983 the unit relocated to Stewart International Airport. It was re-designated the 105th Military Airlift Group the following year. In July of 1985 the 105th became the first Air National Guard unit to fly the C-5A Galaxy. The 105th soon relocated to its new home at Stewart Air National Guard Base in October 1987.

The unit was re-designated the 105th Airlift Group in March of 1992. The unit received its current designation as the 105th Airlift Wing in October of 1995. On March 10, 2011, Air Force officials announced that the 105th Airlift Wing had been chosen as the final basing decision for 9 C-17 Globemaster III's. The initial C-17 assigned to Stewart ANGB, tail number 50105, arrived on July 18, 2011.

In 2009, the 105th Base Defense Squadron (BDS) was created. The 105 BDS trains and equips Airmen for outside-the-wire missions while deployed alongside the 820th Base Defense Group. They are the only Air National Guard component of this elite unit.

In 2017, the 105AW was instrumental in aiding hurricane relief efforts in Texas and the Caribbean. Among other accomplishments during this period, the 105 AW transported four UH-60 Blackhawk helicopters and 60 Soldiers assigned to the 3rd Battalion, 142nd Aviation from Long Island to Puerto Rico for relief missions, and also moved the three HH-60s and many of the 106th Rescue Wing Airmen to Puerto Rico as well.

The 105th launched 17 support missions, and conducted more than 100 sorties, moving more than 300 personnel and transporting more than 50 vehicle and 40 pallets of supplies.

The hurricane relief missions demonstrated the critical role the 105th plays in domestic operations, a key component of the National Guard's mission. 105th Airmen stand ready to answer the call at a moment's notice and serve their community.

In 2020 and 2021, the 105AW provided an unprecedented level of support to communities throughout NY State in response to the COVID19 pandemic. The Wing activated more than 250 members, providing a combined 37 thousand days of support to protect life through a variety of mission sets including call center operations, testing sites, vaccination pods, medical supply warehousing, site security, airport passenger screening and the dignified recovery of remains. The Wing's ability to rapidly identify critical skills sets and deploy Airmen throughout the State demonstrated its commitment to the citizens of New York though one of the most turbulent times in history.

From July 2020 till December 2020, the 137th Airlift Squadron deployed to Ramstein, Air Base, Germany in support of Aeromedical Evacuation taskings.

The teams conducted COVID-19 specific missions utilizing the recently developed Negatively Pressurized Conex (NPC) system. The NPC has provided a safe means for transporting Department of Defense personnel who were fighting Covid-19 and is configured for the C-17 Globemaster III and C-5 Super Galaxy aircraft to safely transport up to 28 passengers or 23 patients, including ambulatory and litter, around the globe.

The teams retrieved almost 100 military personnel from undisclosed locations who had contracted COVID-19 and transported more than 429 thousand pounds of cargo as well as a total of 296 passengers.

I AM THE GUARD



Civilian in Peace, Soldier in War...of security and honor for three centuries I have been the custodian...I am the Guard!



At Concord's bridge, I fired the fateful shot heard 'round the world. I bled on Bunker Hill. My footprints marked the snows at Valley Forge.
